Lift refurbishment work at Goodge Street station

I am writing to inform you that we will soon begin the refurbishment of all four lifts at Goodge Street station. This is part of our essential works to keep these lifts reliable.

From Monday 4 September 2017 until late-2018 the station will operate with a **reduced lift service**, as we refurbish both lifts, two at a time. The work involves the removal and replacement of all the lift components. During this time the station will remain open but will operate as **exit only between 07.30 and 10.00am on weekdays**. If you usually enter Goodge Street station during this period you can use nearby Warren Street and Tottenham Court Road stations.

Our working hours during this period will be during engineering hours (01:00-04:30) Sunday-to-Thursday when the station is closed. Enabling work is due to begin on Monday 10 July to make sure that the main work starts on time. This work is taking place between 22:00-06:00 Sunday to Thursday and is due to be completed by 1 September.

In general, these works should have a minimal impact as all work will be undertaken within the station behind hoardings.

There may be limited periods of unavoidable noise during deliveries to the station and this will be mitigated where possible. All staff will be briefed on the importance of keeping any avoidable behavioural noise to a minimum. We will ensure that any noise is controlled by 'Best Practicable Means' in accordance with the Control of Pollution Act 1974.
